



BUILDING A BETTER I-4

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CONSTRUCTION OF PINE BAY SOUND BARRIER BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 16

The Florida Department of Transportation is constructing a ground-mounted sound barrier at location shown below.

Beginning as soon as 7:30 a.m. on Monday, September 16, residents can expect crews to begin removing vegetation for sound barrier construction. This work will take place from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Trees in the right-of-way will be removed, and limbs from trees on private property that hang over the right-of-way line will be trimmed.

Construction of the sound barrier is expected to begin in January 2020. Clearing the area to the east of the eastbound I-4 travel lanes between E.E. Williamson Road and Lake Mary Boulevard will prepare the ground for the new eastbound I-4 auxiliary lane and future sound barrier. 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IMPROVEMENTS TO INTERSTATE 4 (I-4) IN SEMINOLE COUNTY

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is conducting improvement projects along I-4 in Seminole County that will help keep traffic flowing more smoothly and safely. The projects include adding an auxiliary lane and resurfacing eastbound I-4 from the I-4 Ultimate project to west of Lake Mary Boulevard (FPID: 439682-3) and reconstructing the E.E. Williamson Road overpass (FPID: 439682-4). It also includes resurfacing both directions of I-4 from west of Lake Mary Boulevard to County Road 46A and State Road 46 to the Volusia County line (FPIDs: 439682-1, -2, -5).

- » These projects will help accommodate traffic from the eastbound I-4 Ultimate Express Lanes as well as extend the life of the existing pavement on I-4.
- » Construction on eastbound I-4 began in August 2019. Construction on westbound I-4 is scheduled to begin in mid 2020.
- » During construction, lane closures on I-4 will be limited to overnight hours between 8 p.m. and 6:30 a.m.



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
