Traffic Advisory: I-4 Lane and Ramp Closures Scheduled near ChampionsGate

OSCEOLA COUNTY, Fla. – Motorists should be advised that an overnight ramp closure is scheduled to occur on the eastbound Interstate 4 (I-4) entrance ramp from County Road (C.R.) 532, beginning as soon as 10 p.m. Sunday, August 27 and is expected to be complete by 6 a.m. Monday, August 28. Eastbound I-4 over C.R. 532 will also have a single right lane closure beginning at 10 p.m. and a double right lane closure beginning at 11 p.m. Sunday, August 27 until 6 a.m. the following morning, Monday, August 28.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) advises motorists to follow all posted detour signs. Motorists traveling to eastbound I-4 from westbound C.R. 532 will be directed to continue along C.R. 532, turn right onto Ronald Reagan Parkway, and turn left onto U.S. 27 before reaching the eastbound I-4 entrance ramp. Motorists traveling to eastbound I-4 from eastbound C.R. 532 will be directed to continue along C.R. 532, turn left onto Old Lake Wilson Road, and turn right onto U.S. 192 before reaching the eastbound I-4 entrance ramp.

The closures are necessary for milling and resurfacing as well as repairs of the roadway on the C.R. 532 overpass. Construction schedules are subject to change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

Please continue to use caution while driving through active construction zones. Remember to always be alert while riding or driving.
